It continues the story about humanity's fight against the Ross'El on another battlefield, this time offering humanity a

serious advantage. The reader really doesn't get an advantage though, the mystery around the Ross'El isn't lifted, the mystery around the Valhalla Call of book five isn't lifted ... pretty much everything remains status quo. So this feels much like an interlude. Although well written, I would have liked to see the story continue somewhat more. Meaning less words on the fight on some gawds-forsaken piece of rock with alien species xyz and more words on strategic story. What I found irritating were the constant reiterations. I think the editor missed something there. Up to 50% of the story it's fluently written, gripping, suspense filled ... afterwards the repetitions start in a big way and we spend a lot of time listening to thoughts and speech of the characters. I think we all got that --SPOILER-- training guerillas and igniting a holy war isn't that good of an idea. But then again - wtf cares. Just drop a KEW on the planets afterward and be done with it. I mean, I get it. Sorilla has moral issues with it. But it ain't worth listening to these more than once. Especially not in such a superficial way. That being said, this is the reason for me to give four instead of five stars. This is a really great continuation of the story arc, but it falls a wee bit short of being fantastic.
