I much prefer clever heroines who are sensitive to the world around them and the needs of others.Joe's difficulty in

understanding or dealing with his wastrel brother Benny rang false for me. Joe appeared to me to be smarter than that. Joe's avoidance in confronting Benny and Benny's refusal to grow up showed a lack of growth in either character which I found unsatisfying.
