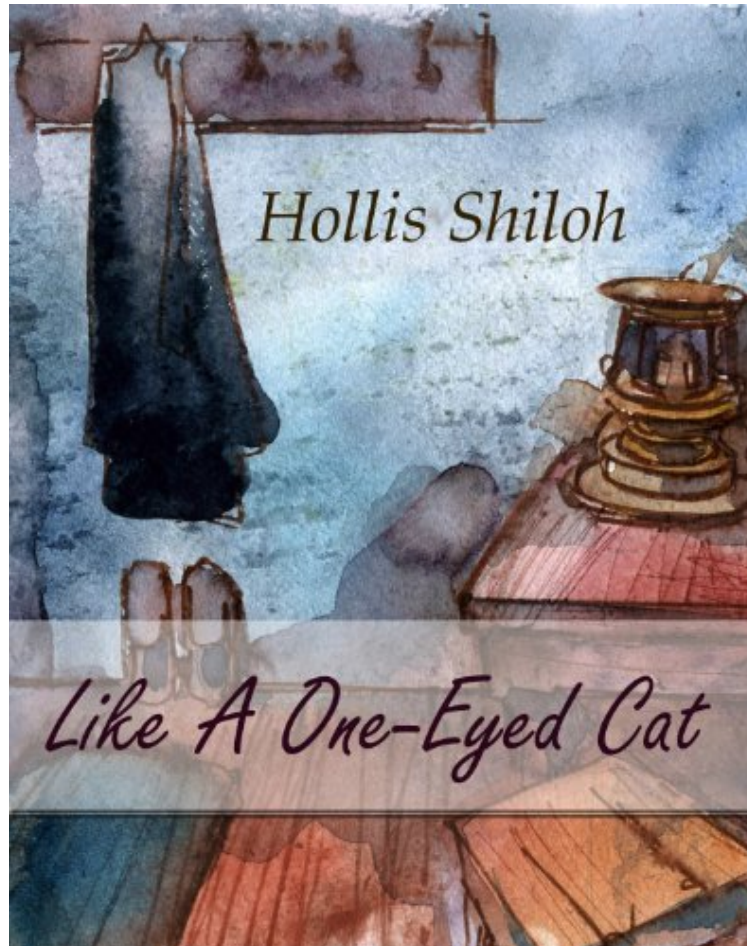

The author did a great job in letting us feel the poverty of Jimmy's life, the consequences of his growing-up without getting melodramatic. Marcus, a soldier who escaped death on the battlefield only by getting him fixed with mechanic spare parts (although we never see them) seems to appreciate every day he lives by being gentle around Jim. This is a romance without being sappy or over-sweet, almost no sex. The steampunk is there, but not disturbingly so. Apart from the mechanic spare parts and the motor car briefly mentioned this story could take

place in Charles Dickens London. A great story to read in-between, not much angst, nice happy ending.
