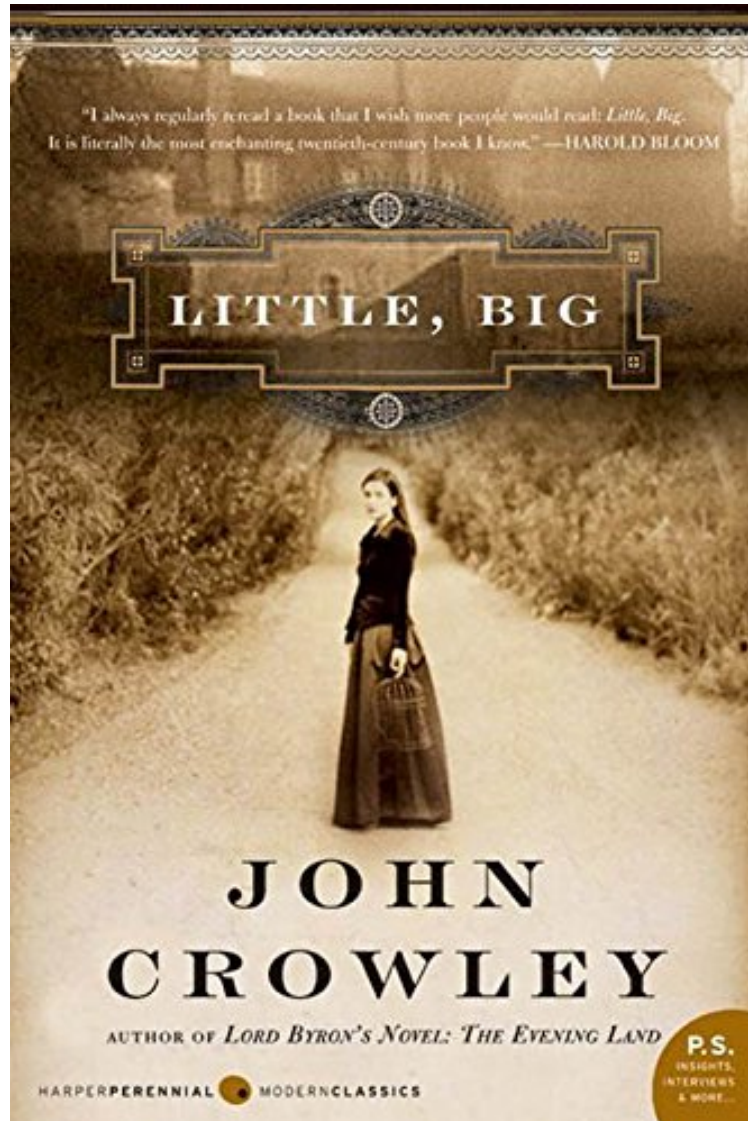

One is lured with the promise of a supernatural tale which should be the backbone of the entire story and that helps initially overlooking the inconsequential plot, the heavy and unnecessarily complicated phrases, disconnected sentences and boring characters. But there is no tale, no interesting story. Blank personages are thrown in, who act inexplicably and do irrelevant things, then abandoned, then brought back to do inexplicable and irrelevant things again. The story has no meaningful ending whatsoever, even not a surprising one. Actually there was no ending since there was no real story. It is just blah. Little, Big transcends genre Von Ein Kunde John Crowley's classic novel of family, faerie, architecture, and, yes, lust, is a truly remarkable novel. While it has fairies in it, it is not a fantasy novel. While it chronicles the decline of a great family, this is no Buddenbrooks. While it gives the reader a hasty history of Beaux-Arts architecture, there is no dust on this prose. And even though this tale is sometimes one of lust, this book hasn't a trace of sleaze.
