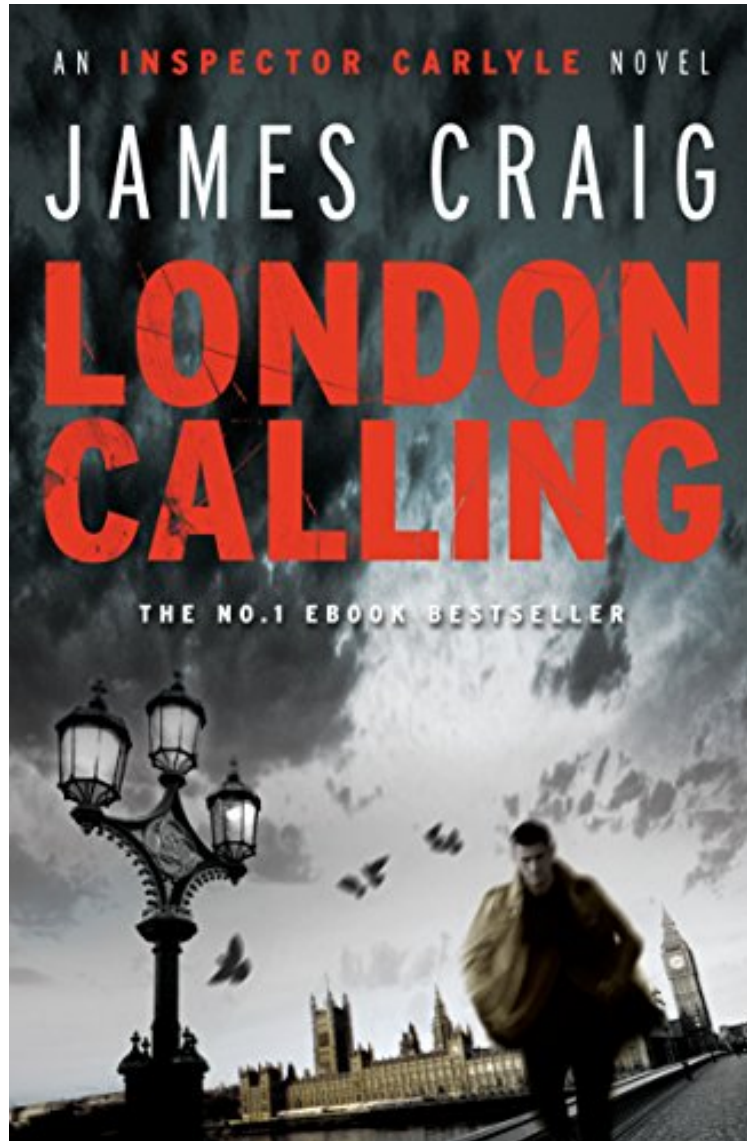

England's Inspector Rebus? Von PZF85JI like the pace of this book. The author does quite a slow build up of the story before the spiral starts turning faster. That's good. The protagonist, Inspector Carlyle, has much in common with his colleague from Edinburgh, Rebus. Ok, Carlyle doesn't drink as much as Rebus and he's still in his first marriage (it's the first book in the series, though), but this may change over time. I don't know. For non-Brits, or non-Londoners, the tours through the city are very interesting. When I was reading in bed I always had my iPad close by in order to follow some of his tours. Interesting! Even more interesting are Carlyle's (or Craig's) views on present England: The similarities between "the current premier" = Gordon Brown, the "future premier" = David Cameron are as obvious as the one reference to a former premier making money in boards and on speech-giving-tours; that must be Bush's poodle = Tony Blair. What bugged me a little: The flashback are too many for my taste. However, that doesn't stop me from liking the book.
