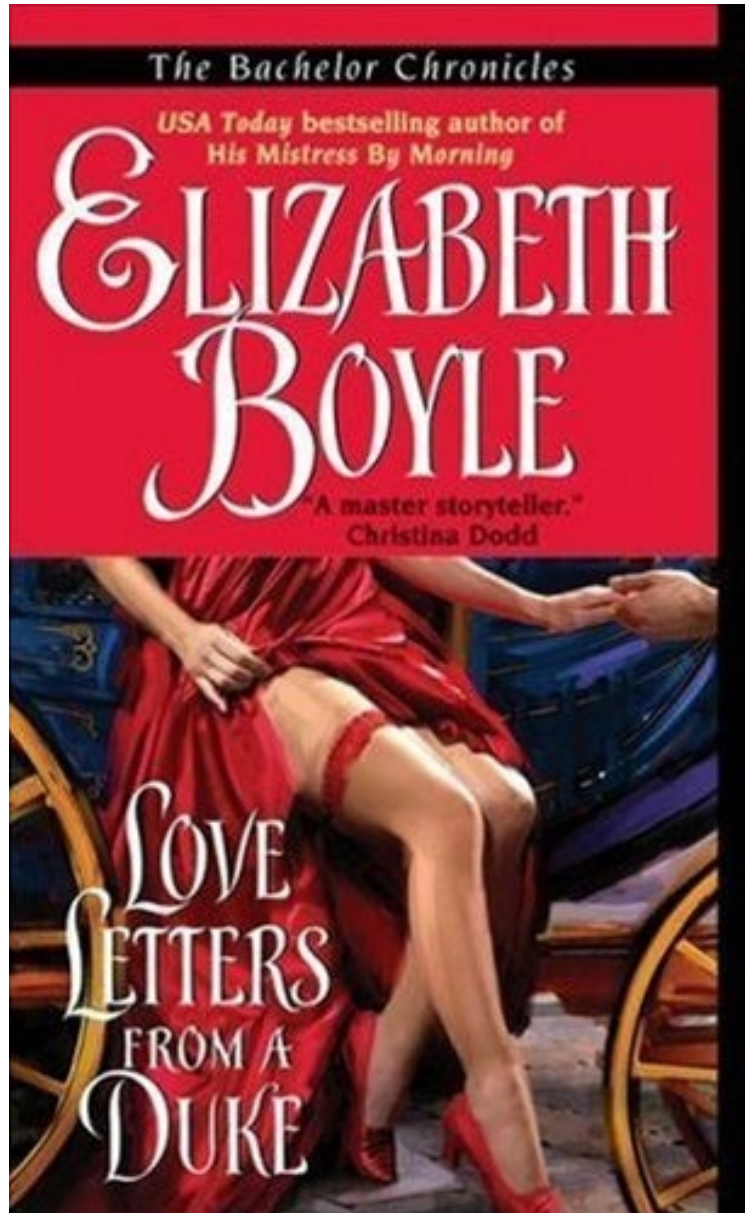

Anachronistisch, aberwitzig, bertrieben und lesenswert Von Beatrice Berger Abgesehen davon, da diese Geschichte im Jahre 1810 nicht funktionieren kann (das würden zwar die wenigsten Romanzen, aber diese hier ist besonders anachronistisch) und sie ein bisschen sehr aberwitzig ist, und mit etwas zu viel bertriebenen Personal ausgestattet, ist sie ganz gut: Felicity Langley will - aus finanziellen Gründen und um ihre Schwester und ihre Cousine ernähren zu können - unbedingt einen Herzog heiraten. Abgesehen davon, da die Zahl der - unverheirateten - Herzge gering ist, gilt es natürlich, auch einen zu erwischen. Felicity korrespondiert mit dem Enkel des Herzogs von Hollindrake, glaubt sie, tatsächlich korrespondiert sie mit dem Herzog selbst, der, von seinem Enkel enttäuscht, ihr in seinem Namen die Ehe verspricht.
