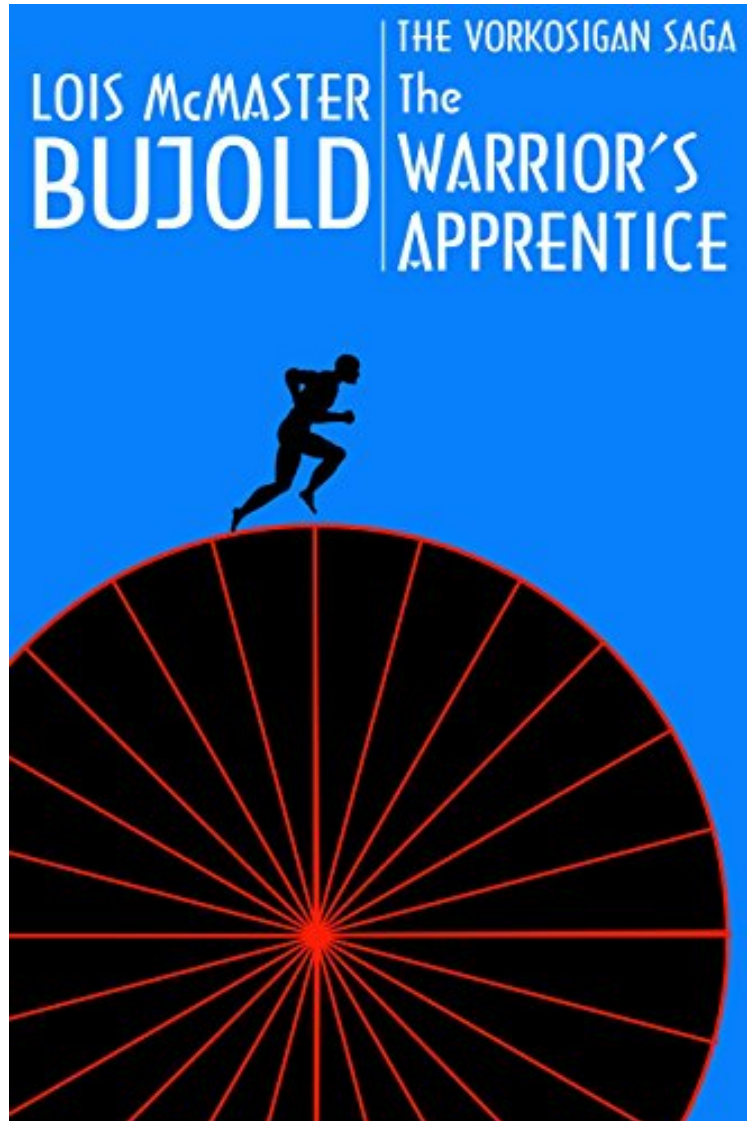

Not that the book has no plot. As in most of her works, Ms. Bujold takes time to set up her tale, but it gathers momentum as the story progresses until, at the end, I felt as if I was traveling downhill at breakneck speed. However, it is the main character, Miles Vorkosigan, who intrigues me most, not only with his intellect, but with his heart. The piece is essentially frivolous, but beneath the fun, Ms. Bujold is telling us something without preaching, about what is perfect and not so perfect, and who are we to say. From that standpoint, I put The Warrior's Apprentice on my all-time top ten list.
