Another great read in this fantastic seriesVon Morning LightThraxas returns for the tenth time, making his way back to his home city of Turai (which was sacked by an invading Orcish army in book 8) ever so slowly. This time around, he's a captain in the army of the West under the command of War Leader Lisutaris, Mistress of the sky and has to investigate a possible Orcish spy in their midst.With his band of charming misfits and requiring a steady supply of beer and stew, reading about Thraxas's exploits is almost as much fun as ever. While this installment did not pack quite the same punch as Millar's (writing as Martin Scott) return to the series two years ago, it's still a fantastic, albeit short-as-usual read. Even though I'm more a reader of what's called "literary fiction" these days, I find myself looking forward to Mr. Millar's books more than almost anything else. He's just that good; don't let the straightforward language fool you into thinking otherwise.
