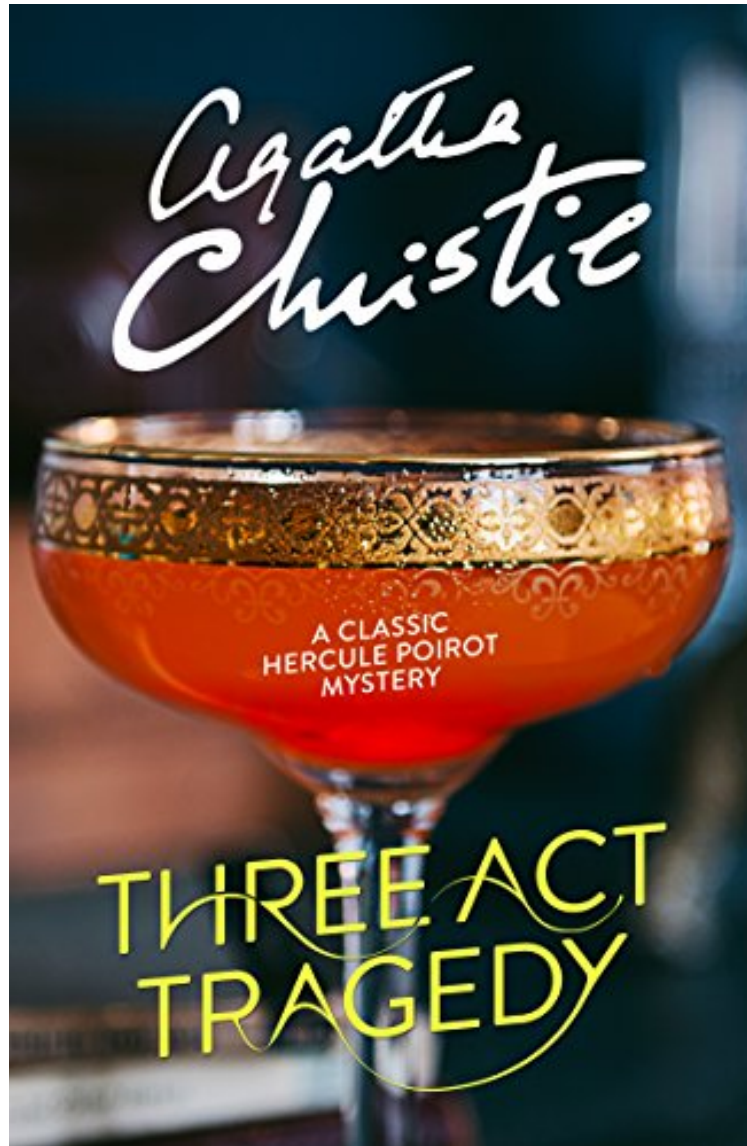

Two victims get killed in exactly the same way, so Poirot sets up a dinner party of his own. It turned out that this was actually a rather tedious book. First of all, Poirot only really comes into the story during the last half. Christie should've learned that putting the

stars behind the scenes is all wrong. After all, that's why "The Body in the Library" was so boring. Then most of the mystery is a group of amateurs looking around for the murderer. You have long dialogues, pointless discussions, all of which make things boring. You have the odd-ball match of two of the characters and find yourselves tangled up in their love affair. Frankly, although I love a good romance, this was just annoying. The best part comes when Poirot stages his said dinner party to uncover the murderer. You're not sure what proof he has found, but as usual, he's found something. However, by that point, I'd guessed the murderer. I usually have a theory, although it's never been found correct. So, hoping for a good ending, I discover that I HAD guessed the right person! What a disappointment. So here's my clue: if you go ahead and buy this anyway, think SMALL. Most of the time you never think big enough for Christie's plot, but this time the murderer, motive (which is a big issue in this book), and discovery has small and petty reasoning behind it. In fact, the whole murders could've been avoided, quite easily. Oh well. It's not too bad--in fact the end shocked me since I was expecting such a grande finale.

Agatha Christie introduces Mr Satterthwaite, who is to reappear later in "Murder in the Mews, "Dead Man's Mirror" by the way. Also a charming little man, he investigates in his own nice style and helps the great detective Poirot. The story revolves around several different characters, each of them getting their share of suspicion, when a second person dies in exactly the same manner as a harmless old parson. The crux is that there seems to be no motive whatever.. - at least until the very end when Poirot enlightens the reader in his fantastic showdown explanation.

We start with a couple of murders, we organise our little group of detectives, they interrogate ALL the possible suspects, add up what they know, and--with a little help from M. Poirot--the killer is revealed. This is a simple plug-and-chug murder mystery. Now, I'm not saying I figured it out. I didn't. And I was surprised by the ending and who the killer was revealed to be. But until the last twenty pages or so, I felt like I was reading a manual on how to write a detective story. A little murder, add colorful suspects, just a pinch of romance, some amateur sleuthing, and, of course, the star detective. A little too by-the-book. I still recommend it because the fun of the ending makes up for the tedium you had to endure.
