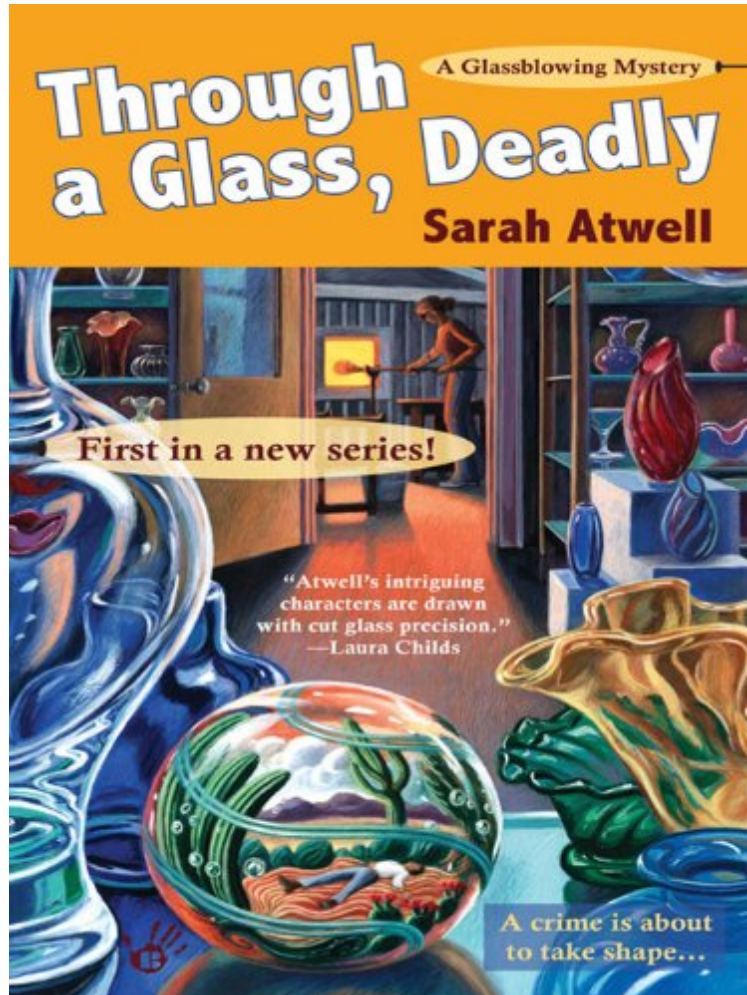

call this a lighter mystery because we don't get pulled down into the emotional deeps and are not confronted with
detailed descriptions of the corpse. There was some fine writing as the author depicted the reactions to the corpse, thus
letting us know how tragic and awful the death was.Sarah Atwell got just a bit carried away introducing new
characters and adding further complications. Less would be more, as far as I am concerned. The characters popping up
like a jack-in-the-box made it difficult to really feel the danger she was describing.I would question the wisdom of
making this a how-to-book. After explaining that her heroine cannot cook and has no time to get groceries bought, it is

sort of strange to find recipes included at the back. Personally, I would take a bit more mystery and less romance. But I have to admire Sarah Atwell: After getting rid of the bad guys, she got all the good guys and girls nicely paired off.

Between teaching her craft and selling her wares, she has plenty to do not to mention the occasional murder to put a crack in her routine. With a weakness for taking in strays from homeless dogs to extra students Emmeline can't help befriending the troubled newcomer Allison McBride. But their friendship takes a dangerous turn when Allison's husband turns up dead in Em's studio. Now Emmeline is involved in a murder investigation that reaches beyond the sunny Southwest. And when the killer acts again, it's up to her to pick up the shards of Allison's life before it's too late. From Publishers Weekly Atwell's breezy debut fires something unusual in the furnace of low-key Tucson glass blower Emmeline (Em) Dowell, just after she befriends a fragile-looking redhead named Allison McBride. As Em attempts to figure out who plunged a man's head into the 2,000-degree furnace of her studio and who the victim was she's forced to resurrect a long-dead acquaintance with ex-lover police chief Matt Lundgren. When she's not busy making and selling art glass and hanging with Allison, Em is dodging surly strangers and trying to figure out why the FBI is so interested in the case. Em is likable; the mystery is satisfactory; and an introduction to glass-blowing techniques and lingo (plus a recipe for Em's specialty, mac cheese with hotdogs) keep things light. (Mar.)
