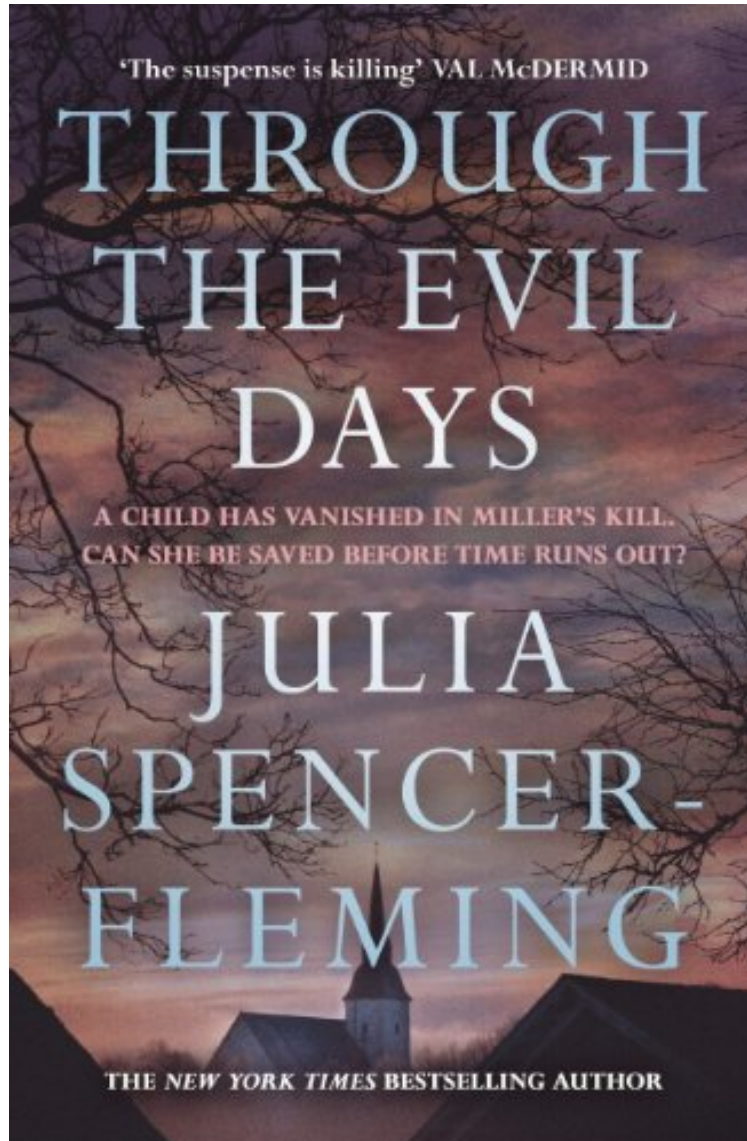

Disappointing Von Cybil I loved book 1, books 2 - 6 are good, book 7 o.k. but not great. Book 8 Through the evil days: Very disappointing. The story is unrealistic, too many coincidences and most actions are foreseeable. To me it seems that maybe a ghostwriter has written books 7 and 8. Everything I loved about the other books is missing. Story is confusing, relationship between Clare and Russ lacks the humor and easiness, they mutate to incompetent idiots. I mean really: Just imagine you, your husband and a child were held hostage (don't worry, I will not disclose what idiot thing Russ did to get captured) by 2 kidnappers (let's call them A and B) in the middle of nowhere. A takes your husband away with him to check out another cabin while you stay behind with B and the child. It was agreed that if A is not back within one hour, B will kill you. A and your husband are already gone some while when you managed to hit B unconscious. What would you do? A: You hurry, get the child, get in the truck (that has a police radio) and get out of there as fast as you can or B: You clean unconscious B's face because it is bloody, then you take the time to pray and you lock the guy up. You worry about the blood on the floor (really?) Then you look around for water and aspirin, give it to the child who runs a fever, wander outside to the truck in the garage leaving the child behind when A returns (what a surprise). A takes B and the child and they take off while you hide. You finally manage to remember that there is a police radio in the truck. You are worried about your husband and decide to look for him but instead of taking the truck (heater!) in the storm of the century (even though the road must be o.k. as A had just driven on it), no, you walk the entire distance and over a large frozen lake in freezing cold weather on dangerous icy grounds only to see your husband in the distance suddenly disappear. He had fallen in the small hole (huge lake remember! I mean HUUUGE) he made a few days earlier for ice fishing and is now soaking wet. I am sorry but I don't think a story like this is exciting, it's dumb and reading it actually made me quite angry and disappointed. If there will be a book 9 I would probably not buy it and it is no wonder that the German publisher is not publishing it in German language. Like Deborah Cromwell (Kincade and James duo) much better. Her books get better and better after book 3 Mrs. Spencer-Flemings are getting worse.
