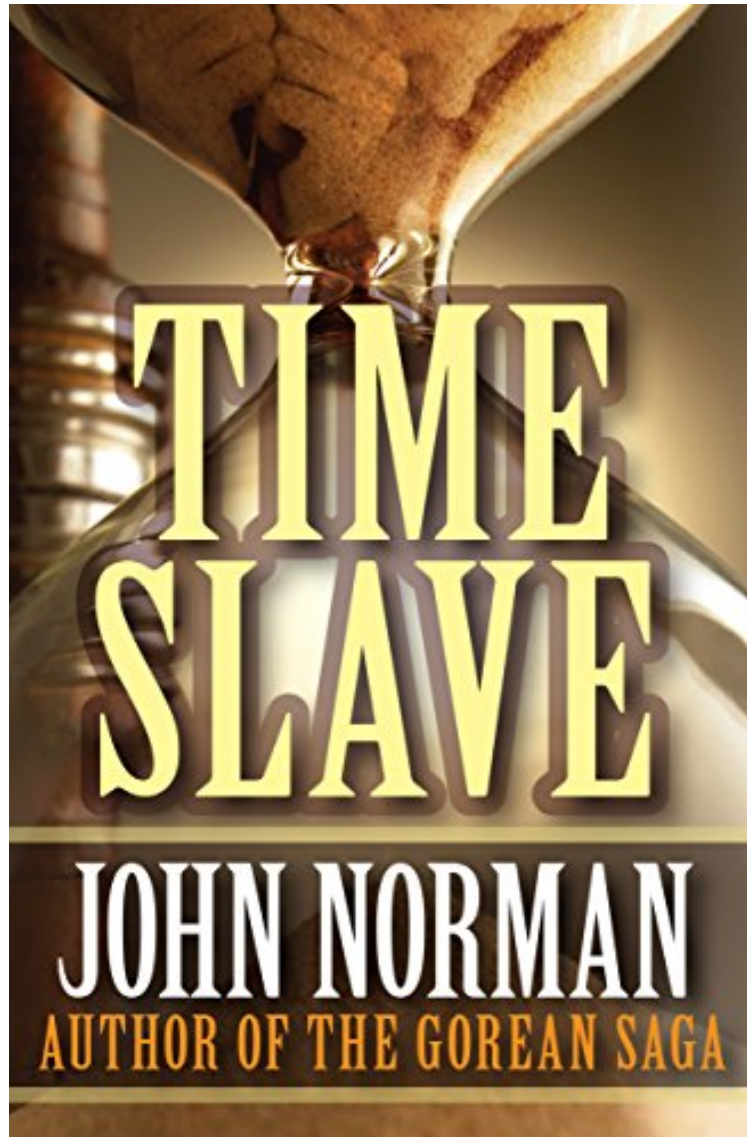

WallaceI've never been able to figure out if Norman is serious or not in what he writes. He writes totally seriously, yet there is some high camp, almost satire to to him. In his novel he blames most of the world's problems on ancient farmers--he much prefers the hunter/gatherers. So he sends people back in time to make

sure the hunter/gatherers predominate in the future. It's strange stuff, as a lot of Norman's writings are. As posted below, it's a combination of philosophy and mild sado-masochistic quasi-pornography. And there really are scenes in which cavewoman undulate before the men to get scraps of meat thrown to them. This is dominance/submission stuff. His books are extremely popular, though--just try and find one at the cover price. I just don't know what to make of them.
